The links between perceived school-based ethnic discrimination and adjustment: Evidence from systematic reviews, daily diary studies, and experiments

School-based ethnic discrimination is a widespread and multifaceted phenomenon that has significant negative consequences for youth adjustment and academic performance. In this talk, I will present findings from systematic reviews, daily diary studies, and experimental research conducted in Germany as well as other countries, with a particular emphasis on the role of teachers – both as potential sources of discrimination and as protectors. I will conclude with a discussion of next steps, including strategies to promote teachers' confidence in effectively teaching ethnically diverse schools.

Sauro Civitillo is an Assistant Professor of Interdisciplinary Social Science at the European Research Centre on Migration and Ethnic Relations (ERCOMER), Utrecht University. Before joining Utrecht University, he was a Postdoctoral Fellow at the University of Duisburg-Essen in the intercultural psychology group led by Prof Philipp Jugert. He received a Ph.D. in Education from the University of Potsdam, where he explored the associations between culturally responsive teaching and teachers' cultural diversity beliefs under the supervision of Prof. Linda Juang.
